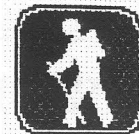
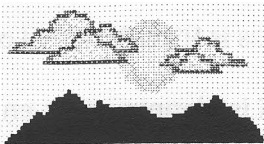

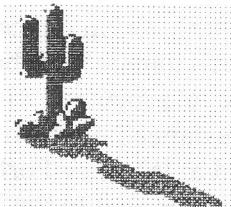

Views from the Top

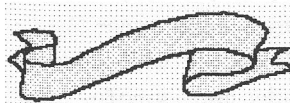

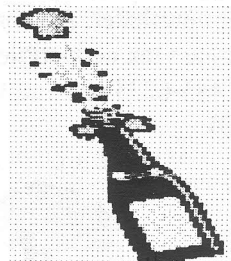


HIKER OF THE MONTH
